



## Saundersfoot, Pembrokeshire

### Start and Finish:

Park at Saundersfoot harbour car park and follow the path to Wiseman's Bridge.

### Distance:

2km / 1 mile.

Extended walk: From Wiseman's Bridge to Amroth is 1km / 0.75 miles

### Information:

This was once a railway line, initially horse-powered, so no obvious gradient and is suitable for prams. This walk has fantastic uninterrupted views over Saundersfoot Bay, with exception of tunnels from Coppit Hall to Wiseman's Bridge, a tiny seaside hamlet with a rocky beach. Why not start by experiencing Augmented Reality using your mobile device (smart phone or tablet) with the Wales Coast Path panel which is located in the carpark in front of the RNLI yellow structure. Head north towards Wiseman's Bridge, a coastal hamlet where there are facilities available and a service bus number 381 should you need it back to Saundersfoot.

For those who want to go further why not carry on to Amroth, a seaside village. Or you could extend your walk in a different direction by visiting the nearby Stepaside Iron Works, a short, flat walk (4km / 2 miles) suitable for all ages.

### Along the way...

Stop off for a paddle or an invigorating swim enjoying the views over Saundersfoot harbour.
